

## Using EIO – Editoria Italiana online

The library has recently subscribed to EIO ( Editoria italiana on-line) from our primary Italian book dealer, Casalini libri. EIO contains the full text of recently published Italian monographs, serials, and conference proceedings in digital form. Publications date from the 1970s to the present, and new titles are being added continuously. It is searchable by author and title; you can also do word searches within the full text. If you search within the text, I recommend that you search for a specific term, avoiding the main authors of the literary canon. Warning – the search and downloading the documents can be very slow, please be patient!

### Specific characteristics -

- Requires Internet Explorer 5.0 and Adobe Acrobat.
- Monographs are only available by chapter (this is because of copyright agreements). This means that you will have several “hits” for each book.
- If you click on the binoculars at the top of the page, you will be able to search by word within the chapter. All occurrences of the requested word will be outlined in red.
- You can limit your search to just monographs, periodicals, or proceedings.
- You can also limit your search to specific publishers
- There is a “Catalogue” where you can browse titles by publisher.
- Saving options:
  - o you can print out all documents
  - o you can download some documents (depends on publisher) – some are available freely, some for a cost, and some not at all.
  - o you can copy and paste selections of texts using Control-C/Control-V functions
- Casalini EIO duplicates some of our print collections, but not all, and I will continue to purchase print materials from the publishers involved.

Right now, you can access EIO from the URL above. Eventually we will include links on the French and Italian Studies library pages and other library pages (Databases, E-texts)
