

## EndNote and RefWorks: Keeping Track of Your References

EndNote and RefWorks are examples of “bibliographic management” software. These programs assist in creating and managing a personal collection of references to journal articles, books, dissertations, webpages, artwork, or anything else you want to have at the ready to reference. And then, it does more! Use these programs to format your references as footnotes, endnotes, in-text notes, and bibliographies when the time comes to submit your paper, manuscript, or thesis in whatever style is required, such as APA, MLA, or Turabian. There are also other bibliographic management programs out there, including ProCite, Reference Manager, Zotero, BibTex, and Bibloscape.

### Use EndNote and RefWorks To

- import citations from online databases
- store, manage and search a personal library of citations
- insert citations into word processing documents and then compile a bibliography for those in-text citations in any format

### Access at Stanford

- EndNote is available at an academic discount at the Stanford University Bookstore as well as through Procurement’s CWA program for departmental use.
- RefWorks is free for Stanford University students, faculty, and staff. The University Libraries have site-licensed RefWorks for the campus.
