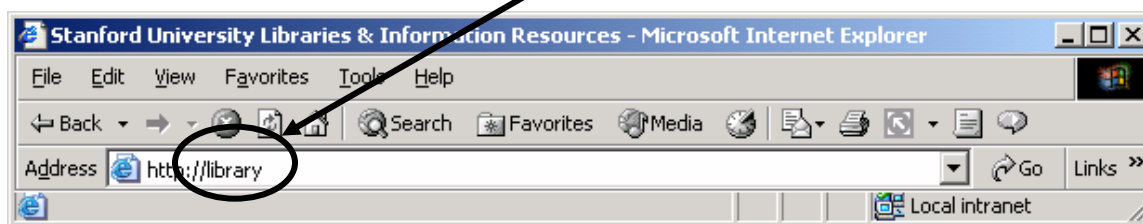

### Socrates search tips:

- The truncation symbol in Socrates is **\$**, e.g., **math\$** finds any word beginning with this stem, including mathematics, mathematical, maths, etc.
- To search for a numbered series such as Lecture Notes in Computer Science, type the series title and the volume number and click on the "Title" button.

### LibX plugin:

LibX <[libx.org](http://libx.org)> is a Firefox plugin that helps you conduct your research more quickly and efficiently. It allows you to:

- Search Socrates from the toolbar
- Drag-and-drop citations onto a "magic button", that will then pull up the article or book for you from Stanford-accessible database(s)
- For easier off-campus access to some sites, right-click to "reload via EZProxy"
- If you use Amazon.com, you can see if the library has a copy with a single click.
