Request for Audio / Visual reproductions

1. Audio / visual reproductions of some archival, manuscript and book material can be made with departmental approval. The Stanford University Libraries reserve the right to withhold permission to reproduce materials for the protection of fragile, damaged or restricted items.
2. Orders for copies of audio / visual materials may be made in person, by phone, or by letter. Orders generally take at least four weeks to be processed. RUSH orders can be filled depending on the number and type of materials requested for reproduction and the duplication lab's schedule. Pricing for RUSH orders will be provided by Special Collections staff on request.
3. All orders must be paid in advance. Checks should be payable to "Stanford University." California residents must be charged an additional 8.25% sales tax.
4. Audio / visual recordings are made available solely for private study, scholarship, or research use of the applicant. In making audio / visual reproductions available, Stanford University does not thereby grant permission to reproduce for publication. The applicant is responsible for communicating with the owner(s) of the copyright; requests to publish audio / visual recordings require written permission from the owner(s) of the copyright and from the Stanford University Libraries. Reproduction, publication, or exhibit of the reproduced materials requires the following credit line: Department of Special Collections, Stanford University Libraries.
5. Stanford University Libraries reserves the right to charge for all expenses incurred in the process of creating reproductions. Stanford University Libraries will provide an estimate of these costs **prior** to creating reproductions. In accordance with Title IV Section 404 of the Digital Millennium Copyright Act, Stanford University Libraries will make audio / visual reproductions available in analogue format(s).
6. Commercial use: Commercial publications are charged a publication fee of \$25 per recording. In addition, a copy of the publication should be sent within a reasonable amount of time to the *Department of Special Collections*.
7. A price list is available on request.

The copyright law of the United States (Title 17, United States Code) governs the making of reproductions of copyrighted material. Under certain restrictions in the law, libraries and archives are authorized to furnish reproductions. One of these specified conditions is that the reproduction is not to be used for any purpose other than private study, scholarship or research." If a user makes a request for, or later uses, a reproduction for purposes in excess of "fair use," that user may be liable for copyright infringement. This institution reserves the right to refuse to accept a copying order if, in its judgment, fulfillment of the order would involve violation of copyright law.
